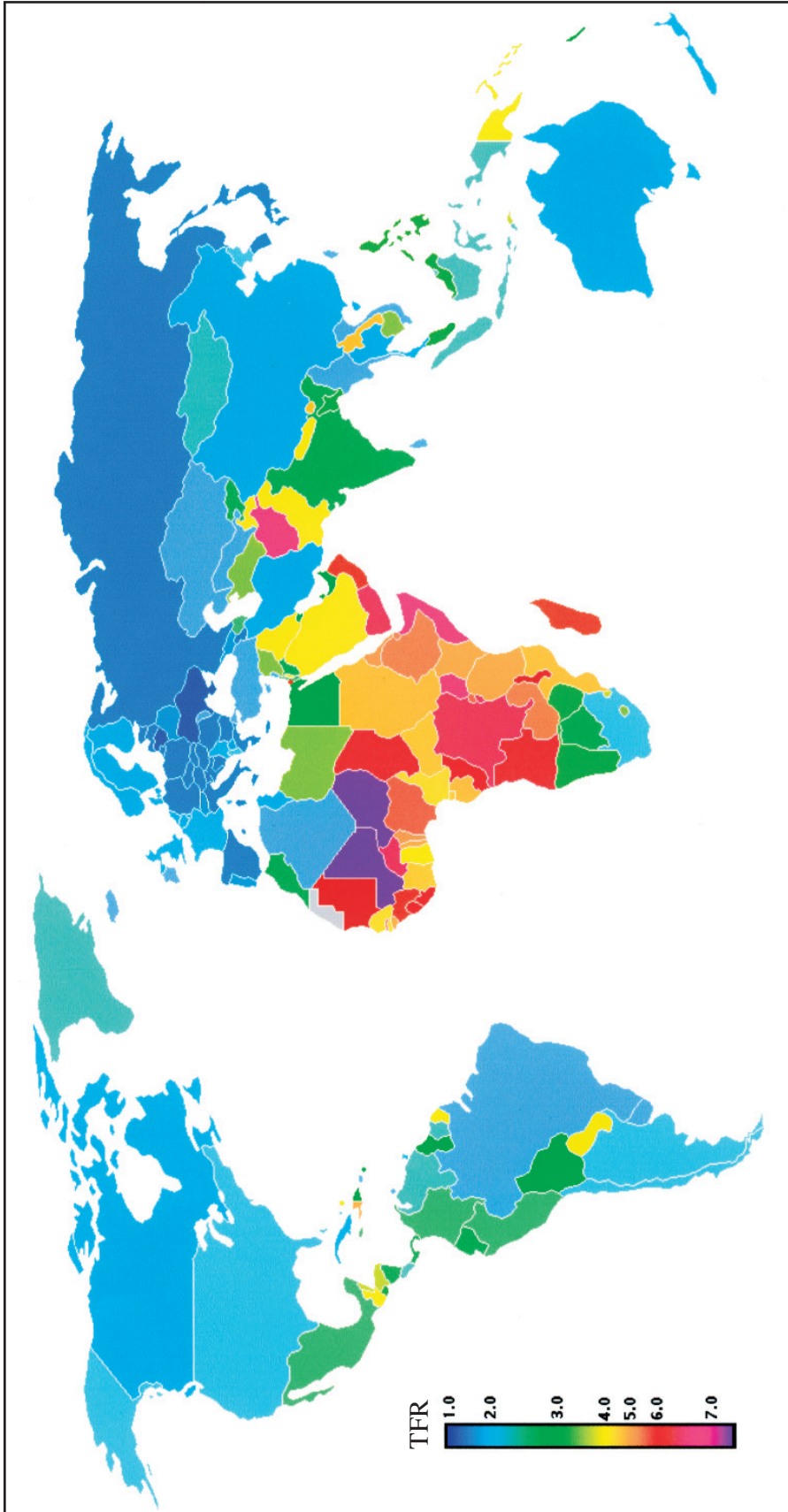


Figure 1: Total fertility rate (TFR) by country 2005

Figure 2: A vertical air photograph of part of a rural-urban fringe in the UK

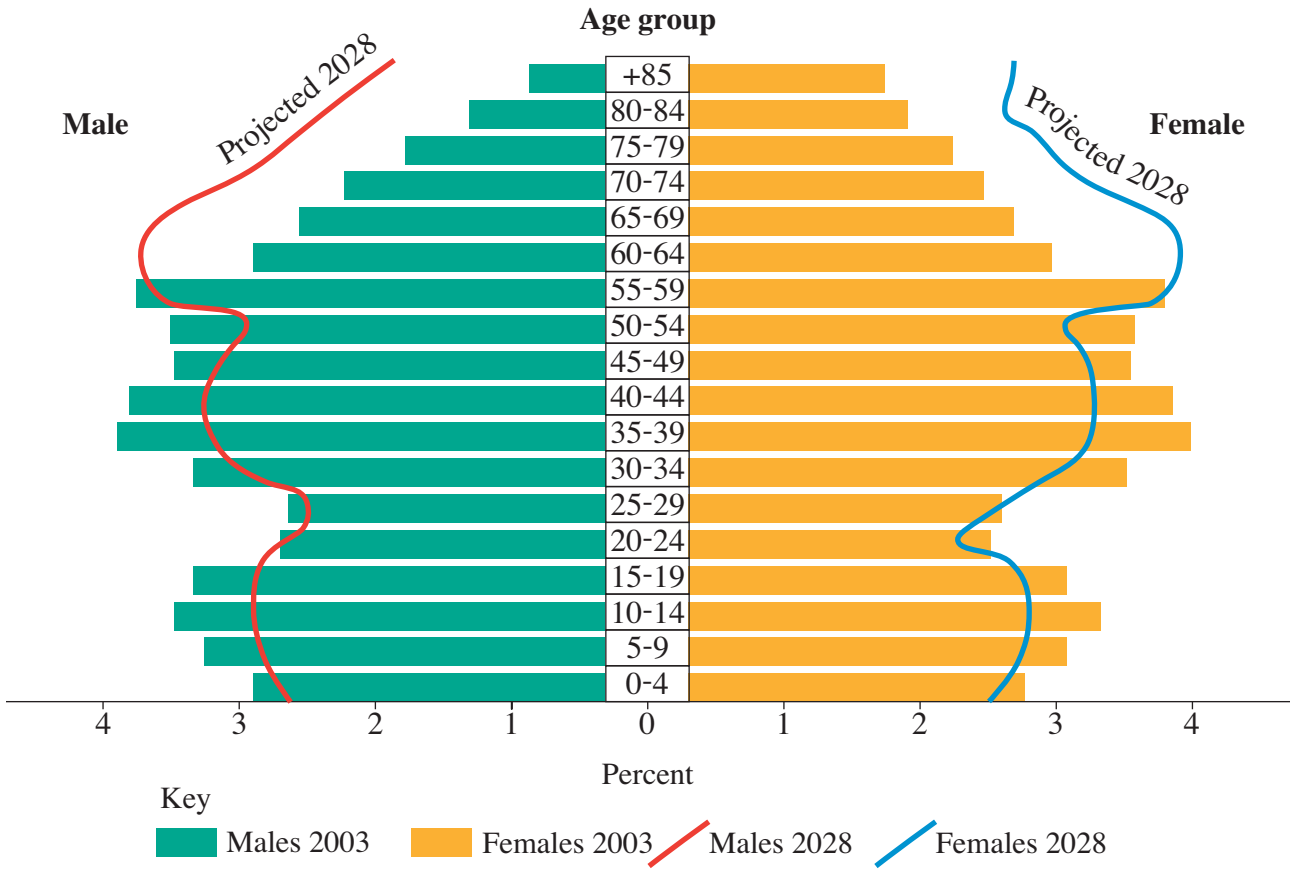
